Subject:- Grant of Conditional Permission to Taluka Shikshana Prasarak Sahakara Mandal Ayurvedic College Shahapur Road Sindagi, Pin - 586128, Karnataka (Inst. Id- AYU0073) with 28 seats (Instead of 40 seats) in UG (BAMS) course, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24- regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Taluka Shikshana Prasarak Sahakara Mandal Ayurvedic College Shahapur Road Sindagi, Pin - 586128, Karnataka (Inst. Id- AYU0073)** inspection of your College was conducted **on 05.06.2023 & 06.06.2023 and revisited on 30.06.2023 & 01.07.2023 on Hybrid mode as** a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM to process **the Conditional Permission with 40 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under Section 28 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
2. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to the following shortcomings: -

1. Teaching staffs

- a. Availability of total teaching staff is $\frac{25}{30} \times 100 = 83.33\%$.
- b. The College is not fulfilling the criteria of minimum 12 higher faculties distributed in 11 departments.
- c. Shortcoming for UG is as under :-

2. Computerized Central Registration is not available.**3. OPD and IPD is not functional.****4. Visitor's observation :-**

- a. No separate register of OPD of ShalakyaTantra (Eye) and ShalakyaTantra (ENT) was found.
- b. In Kaya Chikitsa OPD, OPD register of patient's entry was not available.
- c. No consultants were available in Kaumarbhritya and StriRoga And PrasootiTantra OPD. There is provision of OPDs in two separate buildings.
- d. Registers related with agnikarma etc. were not available in minor OT at the time visitation.
- e. Staff Nurses were not present in many IPD and concern registers were also not found there.
- f. Very less number of ayurvedic medicine was available in pharmacy whereas 90% medicine were allopathic.
- g. Librarian shown during visitation was different from the person who came for verification on 01 July 23.

h. More than half of the hospital staff was not present during photography and most of them did not turn up for verification.

i. Sanskrit teacher introduced on first day was different from the person who came for verification.

j. Many teachers as Dr. Danamma, Dr. Usha, Dr. Geeta, and Dr. Seemaa, who were on OD for camp did not turn up during verification on second day also.

3. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **57thBoard meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **05.09.2023**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no.** dated **16.09.2023** to appear on **19.09.2023** and the submissions made by you were inconclusive. Therefore, once again you had given an opportunity of hearing on **06.10.2023** to appear before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to your college with 40 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2023-24.**

4. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter ref no. ref no **TSPM/AMC/SDG/420/2023- dated 18.09.2023** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Chetan Kulkarni, Associate Professor and HOD, department of Shalya and Dr. Ashwani HOD, Department of Rasha Shastra**, appeared before the Hearing Committee on **06.09.2023** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

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5. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, **and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine(NCISM)**, the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **64thBoard meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 11.09.2023**.

6. Whereas, in view of the shortcoming and deficiencies mentioned in above, and as per the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and it is found that the college was **not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria as mentioned in the hearing letter for issuance of Conditional Permission with 40 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020. However, Board decided to issue of Conditional Permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2023-24.**

1. In case of deficiency in **Functionality of Hospital**, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by **30%**.
There is Non Functionality in OPD and IPD, as per Visitor's Observation Report. **Therefore, in accordance with Seat Reduction policy 2023-2024, for deficiency in the functionality of hospital and department, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 30% of total intake capacity.**

Accordingly, after applying the Seat Reduction Policy 2023-24 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **Conditional Permission with 28 seats (Instead of 40 seats) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24.**

7. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above and after applying the seat reduction policy, **Conditional Permission is granted to Taluka Shikshana Prasarak Sahakara Mandal Ayurvedic College Shahapur Road Sindagi, Pin - 586128, Karnataka (Inst. Id- AYU0073) with 28 seats (Instead of 40 seats) in UG BAMS courseunder section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder for the academic session 2023-24 subject to the following conditions:-**

- I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the colleges/hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant rules and regulations.
- II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 28 seats (Instead of 40 seats)** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

10. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.

11. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2024-25:**

- (i) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- (ii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
- (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;

12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above along with the shortcoming mentioned in hearing Committee observation report may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
